



## Scope

The *Journal of International Peacekeeping* is devoted to reporting upon and analyzing international peacekeeping with an emphasis upon legal and policy issues, but is not limited to these issues. Topics include *inter alia* peacekeeping, peace, war, conflict resolution, diplomacy, international law, international security, humanitarian relief, humanitarian law, and terrorism. The journal is of scholarly quality but is not narrowly theoretical. It provides the interested public - diplomats, civil servants, politicians, the military, academics, journalists, and NGO employees - with an up-to-date source of information on peacekeeping, enabling them to keep abreast of the most important developments in the field. Peacekeeping is treated in a pragmatic light, seen as a form of international military cooperation for the preservation or restoration of international peace and security. Attention is focused not only on UN peacekeeping operations, but other missions as well.

## *Ethical Behavior*

Submission implies that all authors are in agreement about the content of the manuscript and its submission to the journal; the manuscript has not and will not be submitted to any other journal while still under consideration for this journal. It has not been published previously, in part or in whole, in English or any other language.

## *Copyright Permission*

Please note that in case of reuse of figures, listing of the sources may not be enough and the author will need to approach the original copyright owner for permission to reproduce the material in a new publication. Please be aware that this may apply to the author's own previously published work as well (the author may have previously transferred copyright to the publisher). Credit lines should be included in figure captions where applicable.



## Editorial Requirements for Submission

### *General*

The *Journal of International Peacekeeping* only accepts English language manuscripts. Please make sure that phrases in foreign languages are transcribed correctly.

Articles should typically consist of 8,000-10,000 words and should include a short abstract of approximately 200 words (one paragraph only), as well as 6-10 keywords.

Each article should include a title page listing the full title, all authors' names, full contact details of each author (including email addresses) plus a brief biographical note about the author(s).

If accepted for publication, the author should supply editable source files of the manuscript for typesetting purposes (MS Word for the main text and tables, good quality tiff/jpg/eps for figures).

### *(Sub-)Headings*

(Sub-)Headings are encouraged to be used on a selective basis, should be clearly distinguishable from the main text and should be used consistently so that there can be no confusion regarding the general structure of the article (i.e. first-level headings in bold; second-level (sub-)headings in italics, followed by one line of white, etc.).

### *References and Citations*

All references and citations should be listed in footnotes by use of Arabic numerals. Endnotes, a separate bibliography or reference list are not allowed. All references should be spelt out in full at first mention; subsequent mentions of the citation should be abbreviated to Surname, 'Chapter Title' (or *Book Title*), date (only if necessary for clarification). The titles of books and journals should always be italicized and for English-language publications, the titles should be set in initial caps (All Main Words Should Start with a Capital).

## Latin Words

Latin words should be set in italics (et al., i.e., e.g., et seq., et seqq., ibid., cf., inter alia, supra, etc.)

## Figures

In principle, all figures are published in greyscale, not in colour, so please make sure to supply all figures in black and white. Figures should be of high quality: For photographs, a minimum resolution of 300 dpi is required; for linework we require a min. resolution of 600 dpi at the dimensions at which the image is to be reproduced. The image itself should be clear and legible. Each figure should have a caption; credit lines and permissions should be included in the figure captions.

## Proofs

Authors will receive a 1st proof, which is to be checked carefully for typesetting errors. At this stage, only minor corrections will be allowed unless the author has found serious errors impacting the scientific content of the article. The Publisher reserves the right to charge authors for changes other than the correction of typesetting errors because of the increase in cost.

## Offprints

Authors will receive a complimentary copy of the issue their article is published in plus an e-offprint (link to the pdf) of the article.
